
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



Himansu S. Mohapatra is a literary critic and translator and was previously a professor of English at Utkal University, Odisha.


Paul St-Pierre was previously a professor of linguistics and translation.


#### ABOUT THE AUTHORS






R. Narayanaswami, popularly known by his pen name Karichan Kunju, was a Tamil short-story writer and novelist who wrote mainly on historical themes.






# INNINGS

Abhirami Girija Sriram is an editor and translator. Currently, she is chief sub-editor, *Frontline* magazine.


